DISSERTATION	<i>Governance Beyond Governments? The Political Economy of Corporate Social Responsibility</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Committee: Graham K. Wilson (Chair), Dino P. Christenson, Vivien Ann Schmidt, John Gerring.• Summary: My dissertation examines the rise of corporate social responsibility (CSR) and its impact on public policy. Looking at the case of corporate non-financial (i.e. social and environmental) reporting, I show how private actors have used voluntary standards, not to replace government, but to drag it into policy areas that have been neglected or ignored.• Fieldwork and visiting fellowships: Austria (ten months), Belgium (one month), France (two months), Germany (three months), Sweden (two months), United Kingdom (four months).
